



The 2021 - 2022 World Language Webinar Series is focused on pedagogical best practices and draws on the *Teacher Effectiveness for Language Learning (TELL) Framework*. Each 1-hour broadcast will feature TELL criteria from one of the domains and a discussion about how teachers can use the TELL criteria and its sub-criteria to reflect on how effectively they are implementing the proficiency-based *North Carolina World*



Language Essential Standards.

Guest speakers from across the state, who are recognized as model World Language teachers, will be invited to share how the TELL criteria characteristics and behaviors are evident in their classrooms with students learning languages, K-12.

All teachers and administrators of K-12 World Language programs, as well as post-secondary instructors, professors, and researchers, are welcome.

The North Carolina Governor's School is a 5½-week summer residential program for gifted and talented high school students, integrating academic disciplines, the arts, and unique courses on each of two campuses. The curriculum focuses on the exploration of the most recent ideas and concepts in each discipline, and does not involve credit, tests, or grades.

The North Carolina Governor's School is the nation's oldest statewide summer residential program for gifted high school students. The program, which is open to rising seniors only, with exceptions made for rising juniors in selected performing/visual arts areas, is located on two campuses of up to 335 students each: Governor's School West at **High Point University** in High Point, and Governor's School East at **Meredith College** in Raleigh. The program is administered by the Public Schools of North Carolina, the State Board of Education, and the Department of Public Instruction through the Exceptional Children Division. A Board of Governors, appointed by the State Board of Education, acts as an advisory body. Governor's School offers amazing educational opportunities to selected students in eleven different academics and arts disciplines.

- Aspire to Inspire Grant up to \$500, one grant awarded all 4th-grade teachers are eligible Math and/or Science focus. One grant per school allowed. Due 10/20, 5:00 pm.
- ⇒ The Bate Foundation Individual School Grant up to \$5,000, \$30,000 to be awarded - all principals are eligible - art, music, health and fitness, and athletics focus. One grant per school allowed. Due 10/20, 5:00 pm.
- Dr. Bryan Johnson STEM Grant up to \$2,000 all principals are eligible -STEM focus. One grant per school allowed. Due 10/20, 5:00 pm.
- International Paper Literacy Grant \$5,000, two grants will be awarded all principals are eligible literacy focus. One grant per school allowed. Due 10/20, 5:00 pm.
- ⇒ TRAA Art Grant \$250, eight grants be awarded any grade, all art teachers are eligible. Multiple grants per school allowed. Due 10/20, 5:00 pm.
- Toyota of New Bern Tech Grant up to \$3,000, one grant will be awarded, all principals are eligible - technology for your school! One grant per school allowed. Due 12/21 5:00 pm.
- ⇒ Donna & Team New Bern Music Grants (available to ALL schools in the Craven County Schools district) four grants awarded at \$1,000 each, \$4,000 to be awarded. Open to all music-related classrooms and programs. All grade levels, multiple grants per school allowed. Due 12/1, 5:00 pm.
