

HotSpot News:

Craven County Schools students who were issued a
Kajeet or an Orbics Verizon HotSpot may soon see a

disruption in service as those data plans will be expiring.

If students are still in need, schools can submit an order (1to1plus.cravenk12.org) and request a T-Mobile HotSpot. These devices provide 100GB/year...once the 100GB have been used, the device will no longer operate.

(Students should return old hotspots to school and tech services will collect them.)

Online mCLASS with DIBELS 8th Edition Course Description mClass Update

Administrators and teachers should complete the mClass online training prior to the Beginning of Year (BOY) assessment window that begins August 30 – September 20. You can create an account for the training by clicking this LINK, enter your name and email, create a password, click sign up, and bookmark the course. It will be important to use a consistent log-in once you start the course so that you can generate a completion certificate.

All administrators and teachers who complete this self-paced course will turn in their certificates to the school's Assistant Principal. Mr. Jason Griffin will collect those certificates and issue 1 literacy credit for the completion of this course.

We are waiting on the legislature and governor to pass a state budget that will provide salary adjustments including step increases for certified staff members. We have received many

questions from staff concerning credit for their year of service in their August paycheck. We must wait on guidance from the state before any adjustments are made. Typically, any changes made by the state are retroactive to your August paycheck, so you will receive retro pay for any adjustments. We will keep you updated as we receive more information.

- Aspire to Inspire Grant up to \$500, one grant awarded all 4th-grade teachers are eligible Math and/or Science focus. One grant per school allowed. Due 10/20, 5:00 pm.
- ⇒ The Bate Foundation Individual School Grant up to \$5,000, \$30,000 to be awarded all principals are eligible art, music, health and fitness, and athletics focus. One grant per school allowed. Due 10/20, 5:00 pm.
- Dr. Bryan Johnson STEM Grant up to \$2,000 all principals are eligible -STEM focus. One grant per school allowed. Due 10/20, 5:00 pm.
- International Paper Literacy Grant \$5,000, two grants will be awarded all principals are eligible literacy focus. One grant per school allowed. Due 10/20, 5:00 pm.
- ⇒ TRAA Art Grant \$250, eight grants be awarded any grade, all art teachers are eligible. Multiple grants per school allowed. Due 10/20, 5:00 pm.
- ⇒ Toyota of New Bern Tech Grant up to \$3,000, one grant will be awarded, all principals are eligible - technology for your school! One grant per school allowed. Due 12/21 5:00 pm.
- ⇒ Donna & Team New Bern Music Grants (available to ALL schools in the Craven County Schools district) four grants awarded at \$1,000 each, \$4,000 to be awarded. Open to all music-related classrooms and programs. All grade levels, multiple grants per school allowed. Due 12/1, 5:00 pm.
