### **Board of Education Approves New Leadership Positions**

At the September Board of Education Meeting held on September 16, 2021, the Board of Education approved the following new leadership positions for the district.

Dr. Lakeisha Boone will join Craven County Schools as the new Assistant Superintendent for Human Resources effective November 1, 2021. Dr. LaKesia Boone has been in education for 20 years as a teacher, school administrator, Beginning Teacher Coordinator, and Central Office Administrator. She has a Bachelor's degree in history from East Carolina University 2001, a Master's degree in Education from East Carolina University 2008, an Administrative add-on from Gardner-Webb University 2012, and a Doctorate degree in educational leadership from Gardner-Webb University 2018. She is a dissertation coach at Grand Canyon University and is an adjunct professor at Roanoke Chowan Community College. Career highlights include RBC Tribute to Teachers Recipient, Bojangles Teacher of the Week, WITN Teacher of the week, Teacher of the Year, and Aspiring Superintendents Program graduate. 

# Craven County Schools is hosting a Governor's School Informational Webinar!

Guest Speaker: Mr. Tom Winton, Coordinator, North Carolina Governor's School

The North Carolina Governor's School is a 5½-week summer residential program for gifted and talented high school students, integrating academic disciplines, the arts, and unique courses on each of two campuses. The curriculum focuses on the exploration of the most recent ideas and concepts in each discipline, and does not

involve credit, tests, or grades.

The North Carolina Governor's School is the nation's oldest statewide summer residential program for gifted high school students. The program, which is open to rising seniors only, with exceptions made for rising juniors in selected performing/visual arts areas, is located on two campuses of up to 335 students each: Governor's School West at **High Point University** in High Point, and Governor's School East at **Meredith College** in Raleigh. The program is administered by the Public Schools of North Carolina, the State Board of Education, and the Department of Public Instruction through the Exceptional Children Division. A Board of Governors, appointed by the State Board of Education, acts as an advisory body. Governor's School offers amazing educational opportunities to selected students in eleven different academics and arts disciplines.

As an added bonus, teachers report learning with their students and making positive financial decisions for themselves. 

#### 2021-22 Grants Administered by PIE

- ⇒ PIE Grants up to \$1,500 any subject. PIE Grants are cash awards offered by Craven County Partners In Education to encourage innovative and creative educational projects that have the potential of encouraging long-range growth in educational performance. All grade levels, multiple grants per school allowed. All PIE Grant winners win one free ticket to the PIE Luncheon! Two Cycles - Due 10/6 & 1/12, 5:00 pm.
- Superintendent's Exceptional Education for Exceptional Children Grants -\$500 per grant, two grants to be awarded. All ECP teachers at all grade levels are eligible. Multiple grants per school allowed. Due 10/20, 5:00 pm.
- ⇒ Aspire to Inspire Grant up to \$500, one grant awarded all 4th-grade teachers are eligible Math and/or Science focus. One grant per school allowed.

  Due 10/20, 5:00 pm.
- ⇒ The Bate Foundation Individual School Grant up to \$5,000, \$30,000 to be awarded - all principals are eligible - art, music, health and fitness, and athletics focus. One grant per school allowed. Due 10/20, 5:00 pm.
- ⇒ Dr. Bryan Johnson STEM Grant up to \$2,000 all principals are eligible STEM focus. One grant per school allowed. Due 10/20, 5:00 pm.
