

- Priority for students identified at-risk (Depending on space available, other students may enroll)
- 150 hours of instructional time
- Summer School Days & Times
 - Monday Thursday
 - Student Hours (8:00 3:30 pm)
 - Staff Hours (7:45 3:45 pm)
 - Required planning day: June 2nd
 - No School July 5th
- Location: Staff will be assigned to school sites based on enrollment.
- Read to Achieve Camp (Grades 1-3) will be offered June 7 24.
- Summer remediation and testing for EOG & EOC proficiency offered
- Kindergarten students who attend the full program will not be retained.
- Retained students (Grades 1-12) will be reassessed for promotion by the principal at the end of the program.
 - Promotion or retention in grades 9-12 is based on credits earned.
- Transportation, lunch and breakfast is provided.

Update on Safety Protocols Regarding Masks Outdoors



Executive Order 309 went into effect Friday, April 30th at 5:00 pm. Please see the following excerpt from the new order:


WHEREAS, in light of the continued measured progress the state has achieved in its key COVID-19 metrics, and the reduced risk of transmission of the virus in outdoor settings, particularly among fully vaccinated individuals, **the**

state can lift, at this time, the requirement to wear a Face Covering in outdoor settings when social distancing of six (6) feet cannot be maintained; and

WHEREAS, North Carolinians are encouraged to wear Face Coverings outdoors in certain crowded, dense, and higher-risk settings when they cannot consistently maintain six (6) feet of social distance from non-household members;

Beginning Monday, May 3, students and staff are permitted to be outside with masks off *only* if they can maintain six (6) feet of physical distance. Any student or staff member must continue wearing a mask until they have completely exited the building and place it back on before returning inside. However, anyone who wants to continue to wear a face-covering outdoors should feel free to do so and will be supported by all individuals in our schools.


